We operate in the centre of the three major world religions.

The ongoing conflict in the region has a severe impact on our ability to carry out our work.

We strive to provide expert eye care to all - regardless of race, religion or ability to pay.



56% of patients and their companions in Gaza are delayed or denied access to treatment outside of their area (20% for West Bank patients).

- 75% of people in East Jerusalem live below the poverty line.
- 29% of people living in Palestine are unable to find work.
- 80% of Gazans rely on international aid to survive.

• 50% of marriages in Palestine are intrafamilial.

- 12% of the population suffer from diabetes.
- 80% of diabetes sufferers develop diabetic retinopathy.

There is nothing more important in combating preventable blindness than providing easy access to eye care and eye health education.

We ensure easy access via 3 hospitals, 2 clinics and a variety of mobile projects.

In 2017 we particularly focused on Gaza - which entered its tenth year of political blockade. In spite of an increasing energy crisis (6 hours of electricity per day) and stringent permit policies we increased surgeries and launched 2 mobile projects.







Salma is a 10 month old baby who has had two cataract surgeries in 2017 - if she was your child you would want know her eyes were in safe hands, Salma's mother is no different.

We are the only eye hospital in Palestine that:

- has JCI and ISO Accreditation
- is able to offer all 14 sub-specialities of eye care (excluding oncology)
- out-performs all international benchmarks in infection control
- has partnerships and regular visits from some of the world's top ophthalmologists.

Providing world-class eye care is impossible without staff trained to the highest level.

In previous years we relied on expatriate staff - this was not sustainable, especially during conflict.

We are the only eye hospital in Palestine to offer:

- sub-speciality and fellowship training in ophthalmology for doctors and nurses
- continuous career development
- regular teaching visits from top ophthalmologists around the world.

As a result of our investment, several of our nursing school graduates are now in top level positions across our hospital.




- Historically central to the St John story and part of a Royal Order of Chivalry.

All of the above enable us to carry out incredible sight-saving work, notwithstanding the difficult climate in which we operate.



Impacts on our Finances

- The depreciation of the GBP and the USD against the Israeli Shekel (NIS) has cost St John greatly
- Global crises such as the Syrian Civil War has diverted funding typically given to Palestinian causes elsewhere
- Palestinian political infighting caused MoH funding in Gaza to decrease sharply, putting the cost back on to St John
- US Political Powers are threatening to drastically reduce UNRWA funding - a major provider of healthcare insurance in Palestine.

As a result of the above in 2017 we closed at a loss of £1,290,000 on our net operating results.

How we are addressing this:

- Introducing LASIK for private patients in 2018
- Diversifying our funding streams
- Focusing our projects on core costs and working to make our services run as efficiently as possible
- Working to better prove our positive impact in the region to attract new donors
